## AN ORDINANCE AMENDING WANTAGE TOWNSHIP'S GENERAL ORDINANCES, CHAPTER III "POLICE REGULATIONS" §3-1.1 "MAXIMUM PENALTY"

## **ORDINANCE #2006-10**

**WHEREAS**, the Wantage Township Committee has been advised that the New Jersey Statute that provides for the penalties for municipal ordinance violations has been amended to allow for a maximum fine of up to Two Thousand (\$2000) Dollars, and

**WHEREAS**, the Wantage Township Committee desires to amend the existing General Ordinance penalty provisions contained in Ordinance §3-1.1 to comport with the State Law,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Wantage Township Committee, Sussex County, New Jersey:

- **Section 1.** Existing Ordinance, §3-1.1 is amended to delete the maximum penalty of "One Thousand (\$1000) Dollars" and replace with "Two Thousand (\$2000) Dollars".
- **Section 2. Severability.** If any provision of this ordinance or the application of this ordinance to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected and shall remain in full force and effect.
- **Section 3. Repealer.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances or resolutions inconsistent or in opposition to the provisions of this Ordinance are herebyrepealed in their entirety.

Section 4. Effective Date passage according to law.	. This ordinance shall take effect after publication and
